

## KING AND QUEEN CONTEST

County Fair King and Queen are selected to reign over activities at the county fair. Applications are available at the Coshocton County Agricultural Society

Office after August 1. Applicants must be a high school senior during the school year in which the fair occurs and a member of 4-H, FFA, Junior Grange, Girl Scouts, Farm Bureau Youth or Boy Scouts. Applications are returned the night of the scheduled interview and applicants are interviewed by a committee.

Ballots are sent to each 4-H, FFA, Junior Grange, Farm Bureau Youth, Boy Scout and Girl Scout club listing the final contestants. Each member of these clubs may vote for one boy and one girl on the ballot.

Awards are provided by the Coshocton County Agricultural Society. Special King and Queen awards are sponsored by the Sue's Florist & Hallmark, House of G.A. Fisher Jewelers, Liberty Pottery, Olde Warehouse Restaurant in Roscoe Village, and the Senior Fair Board. The County Fair King and Queen represent Coshocton County at various Ohio Festivals and Fairs. The Queen will also represent Coshocton County at the Ohio Fair Queen Contest held in January during the Ohio Fair Managers' Convention.

## QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING REQUIREMENT

All Junior Fair exhibitors with market or breeding projects in the Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Poultry or Rabbits must attend a Coshocton County Quality Assurance Meeting or a quality assurance training approved by the Coshocton County Agricultural Society to enter the Junior Fair. Swine exhibitors must attend a Pork Quality Assurance III Session.

## SHOWMANSHIP RULES

1. The animal must be the exhibitor's project. The same project animal must be used throughout the showmanship show.
2. First-Year Showmanship classes are for exhibitors 12 years of age and younger as of January 1 of the current year with no previous experience showing in that particular show of the Coshocton County Junior Fair. (Sheep and calf lead classes are not considered Junior Fair.)
3. Winners of previous showmanship classes advance to the next age level.
4. Judging will be based on the following:
  - a. Knowledge of the project
  - b. Appearance of contestant and animal
  - c. Contestant's ability to properly show animal
  - d. Sportsmanship of contestant in show ring
5. Age of exhibitor is his/her age on January 1 of current year.
6. Exhibitors 12 years and younger with no prior show experience in a species have the option of showing either in First Year Showmanship OR with their age group. (They only show one or the other, not both classes.)
7. Any showman awarded first place in Supreme Showmanship may only show in the Supreme class thereafter, except horse, goat and cat shows. Supreme participants who do not win first will show in the next higher age DIVISION in the following year's fair.

**MARKET STEERS, MARKET HEIFERS AND FEEDER CALF SHOW**

**FEEDER CALF CLASSES**

1. Animals must be steers (not heifers or bulls) born after Jan. 1, 2008, and in possession and care of the exhibitor by June 21 of the current year. Feeder Calves must be be tagged on June 21 at the Feeder Calf Tag-In. Feeder calves must have a halter on when brought to the Feeder Calf Tag-In just inside the Seventh Street gate at the county fairgrounds.
2. All feeder calves must weigh a minimum of 350 pounds. Feeders weighing under the limit will show in a separate class and will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion. Feeder calves must weigh 350 pounds to sell through the auction ring.
3. The top five feeder calves in the Large 1, Medium 1 and Small 1 grade classes will be placed and class winners presented a trophy. A Champion and Reserve Champion Feeder Calf will be selected and have the option to sell through the Junior Fair Sale.
4. All feeder calves must be treated by a veterinarian at least 21 days before the start of the fair as follows: Vaccinated for IBR and PI3; vaccinated for BVD; vaccinated for seven-way Clostridia; and treated for internal parasites with Eprinex. These requirements must be met to show in the Junior Fair Beef Show Feeder Calf Classes or sell at the Coshocton County Junior Fair Auction.
5. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two beef feeder calves and two dairy feeder calves.

Exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family must own and breed the cow producing the dairy feeder for this class. (Feeder must also be the exhibitor's Dairy Feeder Calf entry.)

1. All market steers must be weighed, tagged, noseprinted and ownership certificates completed on February 2, 2008.

2. Market steers and feeder calves must have been castrated surgically cut or banded, not clamped. Market steers and feeders must be hornless, polled, and have no scurs.

3. Market steers must weigh a minimum of 900 pounds. Steers weighing under the limit will show in a separate class. Steers under 900 pounds will not be eligible for "Grand Champion".

4. If the exhibitor's market steer was born and raised in Coshocton County or on the farm of a Coshocton County Junior Fair exhibitor, the animal also may be entered and shown in the County-Bred and Raised Market Steer Class. This class is to earn

more recognition for exhibitors with locally produced cattle. Only a Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected with no further placings. These animals will NOT sell as champions at the Junior Fair Sale. These animals must be from Book 501.

5. Grooming of all Jr. Fair beef animals is limited to the member, Jr. Fair exhibitors, immediate family members, and advisor residing in Coshocton County.

6. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two market heifers and two market steers.

7. The top ten market beef animals will be sent to the Junior Fair Carcass Show.

8. Market Steer and Market Heifer class weight ranges will be printed in the Junior Fair Beef Show Book

9. Any Market Beef exhibitor not wishing to show in the Carcass Show and Champion Drive, must notify the show advisor before the animals enter the ring for Champion Drive. Final placings of these market Champion Drives must go to the Carcass Show.

**CLASS 7 - SUPREME SHOWMANSHIP**

1. All Market Steers must be weighed on February 2, 2008.
2. Each Exhibitor may weigh up to three animals.
3. All animals must weigh a minimum of 900 pounds at time of fair.
4. Five Rate of Gain trophies will be awarded to exhibitors of the top five gaining market steers regardless of breed. The top overall gainer will receive a larger trophy.

**OLD TIMERS BEEF SHOWMANSHIP**

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older.
