#### **CLASS 4 - SUPREME SHOWMANSHIP**

Winners of Classes 1, 2, and 3 this year and previous winners of Senior Showmanship or Supreme Showmanship. Any showman awarded first place in Supreme Showmanship may only show in the Supreme Showmanship class thereafter.

#### **OLD TIMERS DAIRY SHOWMANSHIP**

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. Showman is required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, advisor, sponsor or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. Judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not on the animal. It is NOT required that the showman own the animal which they exhibit in this class. The class may be divided if necessary.

#### **KIDS AND CALVES**

There will be two classes

**3-5 years inclusive (Adult must be present in ring.)**  
**6-8 years inclusive (Presence of an adult not required.)**

Classes will follow the Junior Fair Dairy Show. Children's ages are determined as of January 1 of the current year. Calves must have been born on or after March 1 of the current year. The calves do not have to be kept on the fairgrounds for the length of the fair. The calves can be brought in on show day.

Calves should arrive at Hunter Arena before 10 a.m. on show day.

The Coshocton County Dairy Service Unit is sponsoring an ice cream sundae and an award for each child.

- All goats are to be dehorned (except Angoras, Pygmies and Meat Does).
- Does need not be registered but should be of a recognized goat breed.
- Meat does will show by age classes with all meat breeds combined. Dairy does will show by age classes with all dairy breeds combined.
- Exhibitor may enter only five goats.
- Each exhibitor may show a maximum of one market wether goat.
- There will be supervised milk-out for all production does (except dry does) 5-6 p.m. Friday at the dairy goat barn. Any exhibitor missing the specified milk-out must still milk out the doe(s) sometime prior to the show in the presence of the official milk-out inspector to be eligible to enter the production doe class(es).
- All goat exhibitors are to wear black pants and white top, except for dairy goat exhibitors who should wear all white.
- First-place exhibitor in the Dairy Production class will be in the sale ring with his/her goat during the selling of the Supreme Goat Product.
- It is permissible to use a short lead strap when exhibiting Pygmy goats. The lead strap should only be long enough to allow the exhibitor to stand up straight.
- Leather collar, nylon collar, or standard choker collar are the only types of collars allowed for showing goats.

11. Pygmy Wether and Angora Wether goat exhibitors may choose to sell the wether in the Junior Fair Auction or choose to receive money from the Supreme Goat Products. If the Angora Wether is sold in the auction, the wether is to be shorn.

12. All wether goats must be castrated by banding or surgically cutting, not clamping.

13. All market wether goats enter in the same class broken by weight if necessary. Minimum weight requirement is 45 pounds. Underweight wether goats will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion.

14. All entries in the Market Wether classes must be eartagged and weighed by weigh-in Saturday a.m.

15. Champion and Reserve Champion Market Wether must be sold in the Junior Fair Auction.

16. First and second place animals in Junior Pygmy Wether Goat, Senior Pygmy Wether Goat, and Adult Pygmy Wether Goat will compete for Champion and Reserve Champion Pygmy Wether.

17. Wethers born before January 1 of the current year are not eligible to sell.

18. All market Wether goats must be tagged on June 28, 10 -10:30 a.m. All wether goats (Market Wether, angora Wether, Pygmy Wether or Dairy Wether) wishing to sell in the Junior Fair Auction must be tagged on June 28, 10 - 10:30 a.m. at the Junior Fair Arena. Each exhibitor may tag a maximum of 3 Market Wether Goats, 3 Angora Wethers, 3 Pygmy Wethers, or 3 Dairy Wethers. For tagging wether goats at the designated Market Wether Tag Day in June, all wethers must have no horns (except Pygmies and Angoras) or testicular tissue to be officially tagged in.

19. All doe goats must be scrapie tagged. All wether goats 18 months and older must be scrapie tagged.

**OLD TIMERS GOAT SHOWMANSHIP**

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. Showman is required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, advisor, sponsor or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. Judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not on the animal. It is NOT required that the showman own the animal which they exhibit in this class. The class may be divided if necessary.

If a given class contains a number that the committee feels is too large for safe ring work, they may make the following modifications: Split the class into two or more preliminary sections and then work off between the high placing individuals from each.

1. Classes are open to all bona fide equine projects. Exhibitors are limited to two animals unless a production project is carried, at which time the limit is three animals.

2. No limit is placed on the number of classes an exhibitor may enter with any qualifying animal (s). Roping classes are open to all Junior Fair Exhibitors with sign up at the announcer's stand on show day.

3. Exhibitors must show in either a showmanship or equitation class except for those showing in the HORSE HANDLING CLASS. Members showing in the HORSE HANDLING CLASS may show in that class only. Exhibitors showing in WEANLING & YEARLING PRODUCTION SHOWMANSHIP classes must first show in either BOOK 600 - Class 1, 2, or 3.

4. Judging and rules will be based on "Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Shows in Ohio" and the "Coshocton County 4-H Horse Program Rules & Guidelines". Exhibitors are responsible for knowing and understanding these rules before showing. Interpretations and application of these rules will be the responsibility of the Steward Show Committee and the Junior Fair Board of Directors. Heights for both English and Western:

- Horses - Over 58 inches
- Large Pony - Over 54 inches, not to exceed 58 inches
- Medium Pony - Over 50 inches, not to exceed 54 inches
- Small Pony - 50 inches and under

5. In classes requiring fences, ponies and first-year members will jump at 2 feet. All others will jump at 2 feet, 6 inches.

6. All tack must be serviceable, safe and clean.

7. Weanlings only will be assigned box stalls. All yearlings and others MUST BE ABLE TO TIE. ALL DRAFT HORSES, HAFLINGERS and DRAFT PONIES (including 4-H and FFA projects) will be stalled in the Draft Horse Barn. All tie stalls must have behind a barrier of a 5/16" link chain, butt board or web stall guard. A tack box is also strongly recommended to be placed behind each animal. Tack boxes will be required to have wheels if they are larger than the 2 x 2 x 4 listed in 4-H project Book # 171.

8. A Steward Show Committee of three Advisors will be appointed by the 4-H Horse Advisory Committee.

9. A First Year Riding Member is defined as the first year a member is actually riding his animal in competition. Any first-year member who elects to enter a walk-trot class is not eligible to enter any three-gaited class. Walk-trot barrels is excluded. See County rule book for complete rules on this class.

10. A contestant must show in at least one contest class to be eligible to show in Contest Showmanship.

11. All WESTERN exhibitors must wear PLAIN white shirts and black pants in all showmanship and horsemanship classes. Ties are optional, however, chaps are prohibited. This dress code applies only to Western Showmanship and Western Equitation.

12. All animals are to be handled in a safe and responsible fashion at all times. Handlers MUST wear proper riding foot wear, animals are not to be ridden double, and animals MUST have on proper equipment (as listed in the "Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Shows") any time the animal is out of the stall.

**BOOK 600 – PRODUCTION**

1. Judged 90 percent on conformation of the animal and 10 percent of the exhibitor's showmanship ability. (This conforms to state rules.)

2. Mares not to be exhibited in ring with foals.

3. Classification as horse or pony is determined by the dam's height.
