BOOK 520 - SHEEP FITTING

(See Fitting Rules)

CLASS 1 - SENIOR SHEEP FITTING (Age 14 and over)

CLASS 2 - JUNIOR SHEEP FITTING (Age 13 and under)

CLASS 3 - FIRST YEAR SHEEP FITTING (Age 12 and Under)

First Year Sheep Fitting age 12 and under with no Junior Fair Sheep Show experience.

SHEEP BREEDING SHOW

Age of breeding ewes will be determined by the judge mouthing the animals. Sheep need not be registered to show in breeding classes, but should be of a recognized sheep breed.

CLASS 1 - EWE LAMB

Female under one year

CLASS 2 - YEARLING EWE

First-place winners from classes 1, 2 and 3, each breed constituting a separate class.

RESERVE CHAMPION OF BREED

BOOK 521 - MARKET LAMB SHOW

1. All market lambs must be tagged on the Market Lamb Weigh-in Day on June 20.

2. Market lambs must weigh a minimum of 80 pounds. Lambs weighing under the minimum will show in a separate class. Lambs under the minimum weight will not be eligible for "Grand Champion".

3. Market lamb classes can be divided by weight at the discretion of the superintendent. All weight sections are considered an entry in Class 1.

4. Market lambs must be slick shorn with a maximum of ¼ inch of wool. Wool length will be checked at the fair weigh-in.

5. Exhibitor may enter and bring to the Junior Fair Sheep Show a maximum of two single market lambs.

6. An exhibitor may enter a Pen of Two Market Lambs which are two of the market lambs weighed in at the June Market Lamb Weigh Day. The Pen of Two may include the single market lamb entry. Market lamb exhibitors must designate at the fair weigh-in which lambs will be in the Pen of Two. The average weight of the Pen of Two lambs will be used to break the classes for Pen of Two. Both lambs must individually meet the weight requirements or the pen will not be eligible for champion or reserve champion.

7. All market lambs (Junior Fair and Open Class) must be weighed at the fair.

8. Market lamb class weight ranges will be printed in the Junior Fair Sheep Show book.

9 Any Market Lamb exhibitor not wishing to show in the Carcass Show and Champion Drive must notify the show advisor before the animals enter the ring for Champion Drive. Final placings of these market Champion Drive must go to the Carcass Show.

CLASS 2 - EXHIBITOR HOME BRED, BORN & RAISED MARKET LAMB

Exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family is to own and have bred the ewe that produces the market lamb. The exhibitor is not to purchase a bred ewe to produce the market lamb for this class. (Market lamb must also be shown as a single or pen of two).

BOOK 530 - SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP

CLASS 2 - SENIOR SHOWMANSHIP 15 & 16

Age 15 and 16 and winners of Intermediate Showmanship 13 and 14

CLASS 3 - INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP 13 & 14

Ages 13 and 14 inclusive and winners of Intermediate Showmanship 11 and 12

CLASS 4 - INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP 11 & 12

Ages 11 and 12 inclusive and winners of Junior Showmanship

CLASS 5 - JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

Age 10 and under

CLASS 6 - FIRST -YEAR SHOWMANSHIP

Age 12 and under with no Junior Fair Sheep Show experience

Not eligible for classes 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5.

CLASS 7 - SUPREME SHOWMANSHIP

Winners of Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 this year and previous winners of Senior Showmanship 17 & 18 or Supreme Showmanship. Any Showman awarded first place in Supreme Showmanship may only show in the Supreme Showmanship class thereafter.

OLD TIMERS SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. Showman is required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, advisor, sponsor or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. Judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not on the animal. It is NOT required that the showman own the animal which they exhibit in this class. The class may be divided if necessary.

Entries in the lead classes are open to guys and gals living in Coshocton County in the age categories with sheep background or interest. There is a \$2 entry fee. Age of contestant will be determined by age as of January 1 of the current year.

The contestant's apparel must be at least 75% wool (does not necessarily need to be home-sewn). Contestants and their sheep are not to be decorated or wear costumes, except for the Costume Class. Sheep must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter. Breeding or market lambs can be used in all classes, **NO RAMS.**

In the Costume Class, both the exhibitors and the sheep are to be wearing at least 75% WOOL.

The sheep in the lead class do not have to be kept on the fairgrounds the length of the fair. Sheep being brought in just for the lead class must enter the Denman Avenue Gate and go to the designated unloading area near the cable to be checked in by a veterinarian between 5 and 6 p.m.

Judging is based on (1) Entrant's outfit, poise and appearance. (2) Control and presentation of animal, and (3) Garment's suitability and originality.

Entry forms are available from the Coshocton County OSU Extension Office. Entry forms with description must be turned in by 5:15 p.m. on the day of show. Payment should be made at that time.

Failure to observe these guidelines will result in disqualification.

Not being Junior Fair classes, premiums will not be paid for these classes. Winners of Classes C, D, E, F, G, and H will receive a special award and five placing ribbons will be presented sponsored by the Coshocton Area Lamb and Fleece Improvement Committee.

Participants in Classes A and B will receive participation awards, no placings.

BOOK 550 - MARKET HOG SHOW

1. Market hogs must weigh a minimum of 230 pounds with no maximum weight limit. Market hogs weighing under 230 pounds will show in a separate class, not be eligible for champion or reserve champion, and not allowed to sell in the Junior Fair Auction.
2. All market hog classes can be divided by weight at the discretion of the superintendent. All weight sections are considered an entry in Book 550 - Class 1 and Class 2.
3. All barrows and gilts must have a measurable $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of body hair, underline included. Ears and tails may be shorter length. Any barrow or gilt may be checked at any time during the exhibition. All hogs in violation will be disqualified and will not sell. Lower placing animals meeting requirements will replace these animals in showing order.
4. An exhibitor may enter two market hogs, one market barrow and one market gilt. Market gilts will be allowed to show in the Junior Fair Market Hog Show, but barrow weight classes will be separate from market gilt weight classes. A Champion and Reserve Champion Market Barrow will be selected and a Champion and Reserve Champion Market Gilt will be selected. These will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Hog that will sell in the auction. The top 12 market barrows and top 12 market gilts will compete for the top 16 market hogs overall for the Carcass Show. The top three market gilts and top three market barrow of 230 and above weight classes will be eligible for selection for the carcass show.
